

Current situation (Wed 1/11)


A slow moving high pressure system in the Bight maintains a ridge east across Bass Strait for the remainder of the week and weekend


Race start (Fri 3/11)




Trip home (Sun 5/11)

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Forecast for 17:00 AEDT on Sunday 5 November 2023












Using Windy showing ECMWF we can see that transition zone a little clearer

Very tactical for navigators













Summary highlights – for a Beneteau 40 at 95% polar:

- 201Nm, 1 day + 5.5hrs
- Ave boat speed 6.8k
- Max wind 16k (gust 22k), min wind 4k
- 17% of time <8k, 83% of time 8-20k
- 56% time upwind, 40% reaching, 4% downwind
- 23% of time <1m waves, 77% of time 1-2m waves

In summary: Quite safe and good conditions for racing

COMMUNICATIONS



- There is comprehensive information in the Sailing Instructions
 - Note TMR broadcasts on all channels simultaneously
 - Sign on and pre race VHF82, shipping advice and start VHF12, finish VHF73
 - Otherwise monitor VHF16 at all times
 - HF frequencies for skeds, 6227 and 8294 (most likely the 8294). VHF unlikely to be used
 - SI change TMR only monitor HF distress from 7am to 7pm
 - Sat phone for skeds to Race Director (0418 396605)
 - Email to <u>race.director@orcv.org.au</u>

COMMUNICATIONS – KEY POINTS

- Midnight, TES will be locked down for competitors to change anything
 - Office can update until Thur COB
 - Late crew changes to Race Director phone

• VHF Sign on includes NoR declaration and PoB.

• Ray Shaw will monitor VHF 82 pre start.

• Skeds:

- The position recorded is 15mins prior to the hour
- Satphone reporting of that position is 10mins prior to the hour
- HF reporting of that position is 5 mins after the hour
- Sat phone skeds history tells us many of you will miss them. DON'T. Set an alarm, do whatever you need to do. Especially DH.



SWITCH ON AND MONITOR

- Actively monitor VHF16 and your Sat phone
 - Which means don't turn them off or turn the volume down so crew can sleep. Ideally have a speaker or handheld on deck

We may need you to relay a message

• e.g. We may need you to communicate with a nearby vessel in distress

We may need you to rescue someone

You can't help if you can't be contacted

It may help avoid an incident

• A recent serious run aground could have been avoided if the competitor was monitoring VHF 16 and heard the other nearby competitor's warning








TRACKER – PICK IT UP FROM THE SAILING OFFICE AT YOUR CLUB



- Turn it on before you leave the dock and check it is tracking
- Fit it to your pulpit with clear line of sight to the satellites
- Update interval 10mins (1hr on the way home)
- It will be charged, but carry a micro USB cable just in case
- We would like you to use the tracker on the way home. It is <u>your responsibility</u> to return it to the ORCV office by the 17th November 2023



HEADS EXIT – LEAVE OBSTRUCTION TO PORT SIDE




A reminder for the return. Skippers who enter the Rip on the western side using **ORCVA** (Shortland Bluff) the Fort West ISO (flashing) beacon, its (\$38° 16.90' E144° 38.90') worth remembering that boats need to be well into the white sector of the Beacon in order to line up with 4 Fingers West. Obstruction **Do Not Enter** From **ORCVB** (Heads Exit) Starting (538 97.95 E144 37.76 Area ORCVD (Big Rock) (\$38° T8:00' E144° 38.67 **ORCVC** (Channel Clearing) (S38° 18.50' E144' 36.80')

- You must take a photo of your heads exit track on your plotter
- Provide to the Race **Director upon request**
- We will be watching AIS !!

PILOT BOARDING GROUND – OBSTRUCTION, KEEP CLEAR






• You shouldn't be anywhere near it

• Again, take a photo of your track on your plotter

YOLLA PLATFORM, KEEP CLEAR





- The Yolla platform is very close to rhumb, if you head East be aware.
- Legally you must keep well clear, at least 2Nm.
- Previously competitors have gone too close and were warned off on VHF 16, a slap on the wrist for the ORCV.
- Chart position is apparently incorrect, up to 200m Paul Roberts tells us



FINISHING


- Finishing Reports
 - 60 Minutes SMS or VHF 73
 - 5 Minutes (VHF 73)

• Finish

- At night, look for the **<u>Rotating Orange Light</u>**
- Record your own time (GPS)
- RD will confirm finishing on VHF73

• Post Finish

- Drop sails and motor up the river
- Be careful at the entrance and keep clear of commercial shipping
- There may be an escort tender to help navigate the river (VHF 73)
- Complete and submit your Race Declaration (SMS or Email it if returning straight away)



COMMERCIAL SHIPPING IN THE CHANNEL

- Keep clear, especially at river entrance
 - The port control is VTS and they are on Channel 14
 - Keep clear of docking and manoeuvring

- Follow the escort instructions.
- There wont be an escort when you depart, follow your incoming track.
- Note the guide in the SIs, especially as you approach the yacht club
- Don't cut corners and pay attention








Prepare for current (eg Ferry glide in, keep bow pointing into the current)

Slower boats will need to raft up, it is a long floating dock

Getting out could be interesting, especially if you want to leave early








RAFTING ETIQUETTE – TELL YOUR NEW CREW







- If possible, seek the permission of the boat you are about to come alongside.
- Use plenty of fenders. Set springs and breast ropes see diagram.
- Moor so the masts are not in line they may clash if the boats roll.
- Don't leave all the free ends of your warps on the other boat's deck, tie off on your boat
- Don't grab or push stanchions or guard wires to hold yourself alongside, they are not strong enough.
- Always put shore lines out and try to keep them fairly tight, allowing for tide
- Seek permission, as a courtesy, before you cross another boat's deck for the first time
- Always walk around the front of a boat, not through the cockpit
- Wear deck shoes so as not to mark/damage decks.
- Try to be as light footed as possible when crossing decks, particularly after the pub
- · Leave a note to warn others of your departure time, and leave when you say


